

Nativity Epistle 2010

Beloved brothers and sisters, sons and daughters of Christ's Church, my dear Christians,

Christ is born! The angels praise His birth on high, above the cave they give glory to God in the highest and proclaim His peace upon the earth. The shepherds of Bethlehem worship the Babe born in a manger, wondering at what they have seen and heard on this holy night. Having journeyed from their distant orient, the wise men bring gifts to the One Whom the whole of creation has awaited through all eternity, and Whom they have so zealously sought. Before departing this life, the righteous Symeon with love receives in his arms Him, Whom in faith and hope he has patiently awaited his whole life.

The One awaited throughout the ages has come and brought light to the world! The pre-eternal God has become incarnate from a pure Virgin! Christ is born!

The shepherds, who were close by, received the good tidings from the angels. The other people of Bethlehem were also nearby, but either, because of their indifference did not heed the angels, or perhaps they closed their hearts as they had closed their doors, and made themselves incapable of seeing the angels, incapable of hearing them.

The wise men lived far off and did not have the benefit of the Holy Scriptures, but, with their whole heart they sought Him as they could, and when the Lord sent them the star, they did not hesitate to follow it. Dear brothers and sisters, let us choose the good part - with the shepherds, let us keep watch; with the angels, let us sing praise; with the wise men, let us spare no effort to come and worship, and in the Holy Mysteries, with the righteous Symeon, let us receive the Saviour Who for our sake was born this day.
